For the past five out the six months I have worked here I have taken money from either bank deposits, the atm, or the safe. It first started by only taking a few dollars here and there out of nightly deposits and then escalated into taking it from other areas which I thought were less detected. Taking the ATM cartridge out nightly to put into a safe place at night made it easy to take from which started at 20 dollars and then ranged from \$20 to \$100.00 per night. While refilling the atm frequently I was able to ^{Put in the amount} ~~change the amount~~ into the computer side of it and subtracted the amount I actually put. Taping in the ATM that I put in \$500.00 when really I only put in \$400.00 and kept the hundred for myself.

When I decided to find other means of taking the money I would take \$20.00 here \$40.00 there from drawers not being used by concessions at that time that was located in the safe.

② ~~_____~~ I also found a way of taking small amounts ranging from two to ten dollars out of the bundles of ones we were getting from bank coin orders then I divided the one dollar bill I had taken and recirculated them into the cash drawers and took out larger bills instead.

At my closest possible estimate I have probably taken the sum total of about ^{\$5,000.00} \$5,000.00 from deposits, cash drawers atm, and the coin orders. ~~The~~ last time I had taken money was 2 days ago and was around fifty dollars.

My lack of judgement is one of the main reasons for taking what wasn't rightfully mine. The stress of working full time, going to school full time, and mounting doctor bills & prescriptive refills from the graves disease I was diagnosed with months ago. The mounting debt my wife & I have accumulated has also was a contribution to my stupidity and which led me to act in a way that is not normally something that I would do.

I am 100% guilty and I am not going to attempt to reason my way out of it rather just accept the consequences of the poor wrong decisions I made. I was informed I would receive a copy of this testimony
